Activity Bag for YL

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Discuss:

- 1. Why is it important to include games in the class?
- 2. What games are good to play with YL?



Why is it important to include games?

- More motivation: Students become more motivated to learn and participate.
- * Attentiveness: As games move quickly and there is an element of challenge and competition, students must be alert and attentive for longer periods.
- Engaging Practice: Learners need a lot of practice to internalize vocabulary and structures and games offer meaningful and engaging opportunities to do so in a stress-free environment.

Why is it important to include games?

- * Facilitate Learning: Games stand out in students' memories making it easy to recall vocabulary and structures.
- * Different Stimuli: Students may remember vocabulary/ structures from acting them out, others may remember hearing classmates call out answers, others may remember reading some clues, etc.
 - Other Skills: Games allow students to learn how to work together, take turns, build respect, listen to others and play fairly.

What games are good to play with YL?

A game is "an activity with rules, a goal and an element of fun" (Hadfield, 1998)

- Easy to explain and set up in the classroom
- In accordance with students' age and level of English
- Students practice or refresh vocabulary / structures (not just for fun)
- Not too long, otherwise students will lose interest
