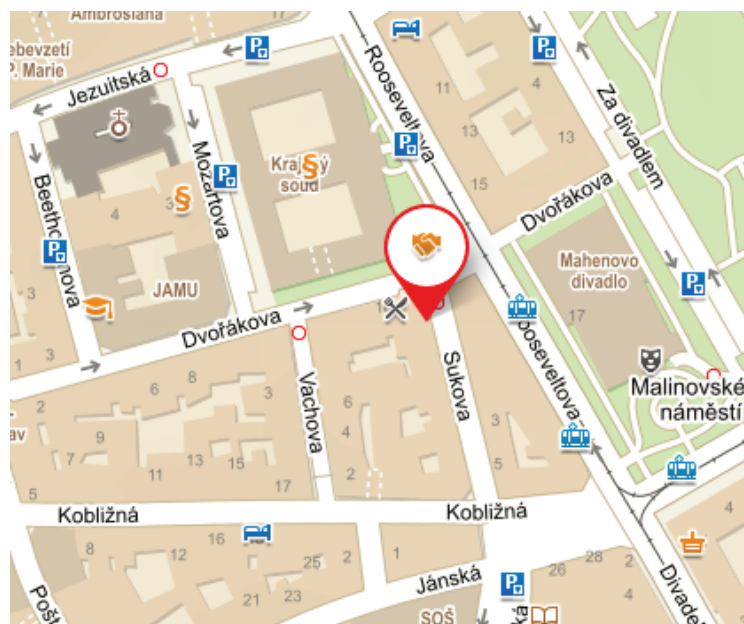

Virtual Reality in your classroom - and other steps in the digital transformation

Virtual Reality has become one of the most innovative teaching tools in many educational sectors. Jonathan will introduce you to the Virtual Reality 4 Language Learning (VR4LL) project, where they are developing an innovative platform for carrying out collaborative group language exercises in the classroom. These will provide an opportunity for students to practise the target language in a fully immersive way.

Josip will then give you an update and some insight into another exciting project that is playing a part in transforming language education around the world. Next Generation Placement Tests is an innovative digital system that allows for adaptive testing, i.e. it tests students at their level.

Jonathan and Josip are bringing their VR headsets and other innovative tools for you to try out in the lunch break too! Make sure you stop by the 'Innovations Corner'.

Both projects are funded by the Erasmus+ program.



Jonathan has spent most of his professional life in language school management. He founded Net Languages, a Web-based language school, and he was also co-founder of Green Standard Schools, an association of schools committed to protecting the environment. VR4LL is one of several Erasmus projects he is currently working on.



Josip Sobin has been working as CEO of Jantar – IH Split for the past 10 years. With his focus on internationalisation and quality assurance, he navigated his school towards joining the International House affiliation and becoming a Cambridge Assessment English Exam Centre. Stories play an important part in our lives, and in language teaching. In this session we will showcase two incredible projects that make use of the power of stories to bring fantastic opportunities to your students. Dave will talk about City Stories; the local legends of three iconic European cities - Barcelona, Split and Brno - are being turned into Digital Escape Rooms for learners to both enjoy the stories and learn about culture and language.

Following this, Josip from International House Split will introduce you to Remote Theatre. This is an exciting new genre of theatre that is being used to help learners of English to rehearse and eventually perform plays that they have created themselves to audiences around the world. It provides an opportunity for young people to find a space where they can practice English, interact spontaneously, and share something of who they are and what they want to say in an interesting and very motivating context.

Dave Cleary is a DELTA qualified English language teacher and teacher trainer living and working in Brno. He came to the Czech Republic in the summer of 2000 and has worked here ever since.
